Organization of American Historians Distinguished Lecturer Adrienne D. Davis joined the law faculty at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill in 2000. Her scholarship emphasizes the gendered dimensions of American slavery, including the regulation of sexuality under slavery and its ongoing implications for law and social norms. She also does work on theories of commodification. Davis is former editor of the *Journal of Legal Education and Law and History Review* and past chair of the Law and Humanities Section of the American Association of Law Schools. She is a consultant with a litigation project seeking reparations for African Americans and a frequent lecturer on the topic of legal history and legal theory, race, and gender.
